GIVING A NOTICE OF RENT INCREASE:

- A landlord may increase the rent only once per year; either 12 months after the tenant moved in, or 12 months since the last increase became effective.
- This notice must be received by the tenant at least 3 full months before the increase is to take effect, or, if the notice of Rent increase concerns a Manufactured Home Site in circumstances other than where the Tenant is renting a Manufactured Home and the Manufactured Home Site under a single Tenancy Agreement, at least 6 full months before the increase is to take effect.
- It is an offence for a landlord or a landlord's agent to issue a notice of rent increase in any other manner.
- The notice may be served in accordance with section 10.14 of the *STÁUTW First Nation Residential Tenancy Law*. For example, the notice may be given personally, sent by registered mail, etc. A notice sent by registered mail is deemed to be received on the 5th day after it was mailed, or on the date it was signed for. For further information on giving a notice of rent increase, see Part 6 of the *STÁUTW First Nation Residential Tenancy Law* and in particular section 6.7 of the Law or telephone the Administrator at the number set out below.

DISPUTING A NOTICE OF RENT INCREASE:

- Should the tenant believe the increase to be unjustified, the tenant has 30 days from the day of receiving the notice to apply to the Administrator for arbitration.
- The administrator may provide information to the parties and any cases where the parties are not able to resolve the dispute, shall be referred to arbitration.
- The landlord must provide the Arbitrator with a copy of the Statement of Rent Increase Information at the arbitration hearing.
- There is a \$*[insert amount]* fee for filing for arbitration; however, all or part of it may be awarded to either of the parties if an arbitrator so rules
- The arbitrator's decision is final and binding.
